## Introduction

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful high adventure program in several ways:

- ❖ Help Venturing and Boy Scout leaders to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature.
- ❖ Provide an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead their Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure.
- ❖ Familiarize the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer meet the requirements of the Ranger Award.

This course is based on the Ranger Award requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities.

The course will include the following Ranger Award Core Requirements and many of the Electives: First Aid; Communications; Cooking; Emergency Preparedness; Land Navigation; Leave No Trace; Wilderness Survival; Conservation; Backpacking; Cave Exploring; Cycling/Mountain Biking; Ecology; Equestrian;

Fishing; Hunting; Lifesaver; Mountaineering; Outdoor Living History; Physical Fitness; Plants and Wildlife; Project COPE; Scuba; Shooting Sports; Watercraft and Winter Sports.

## Learning Objectives

After completing this course participants should have sufficient introductory information that will provide the following outcomes:

- ❖ Detailed knowledge of the Ranger Award and associated Silver Award requirements.
- ❖ Knowledge of the health and safety requirements, rules and regulations of the Boy Scouts of America as they apply to outdoor programs.
- ❖ Introduction to the skills necessary to operate their outdoor program and the various certifications necessary and how to obtain those certifications.
- ❖ Knowledge of how to identify local resources and consultants for Ranger Award and high adventure activities.

### Please Note:

This course is *not* a total training program, which will enable the adult leader to be an expert or even self-sufficient in any aspect of outdoor skills. The leaders will most likely still need knowledgeable, trained and certified individuals (consultants) to help provide a safe and correct outdoor/high adventure program.
